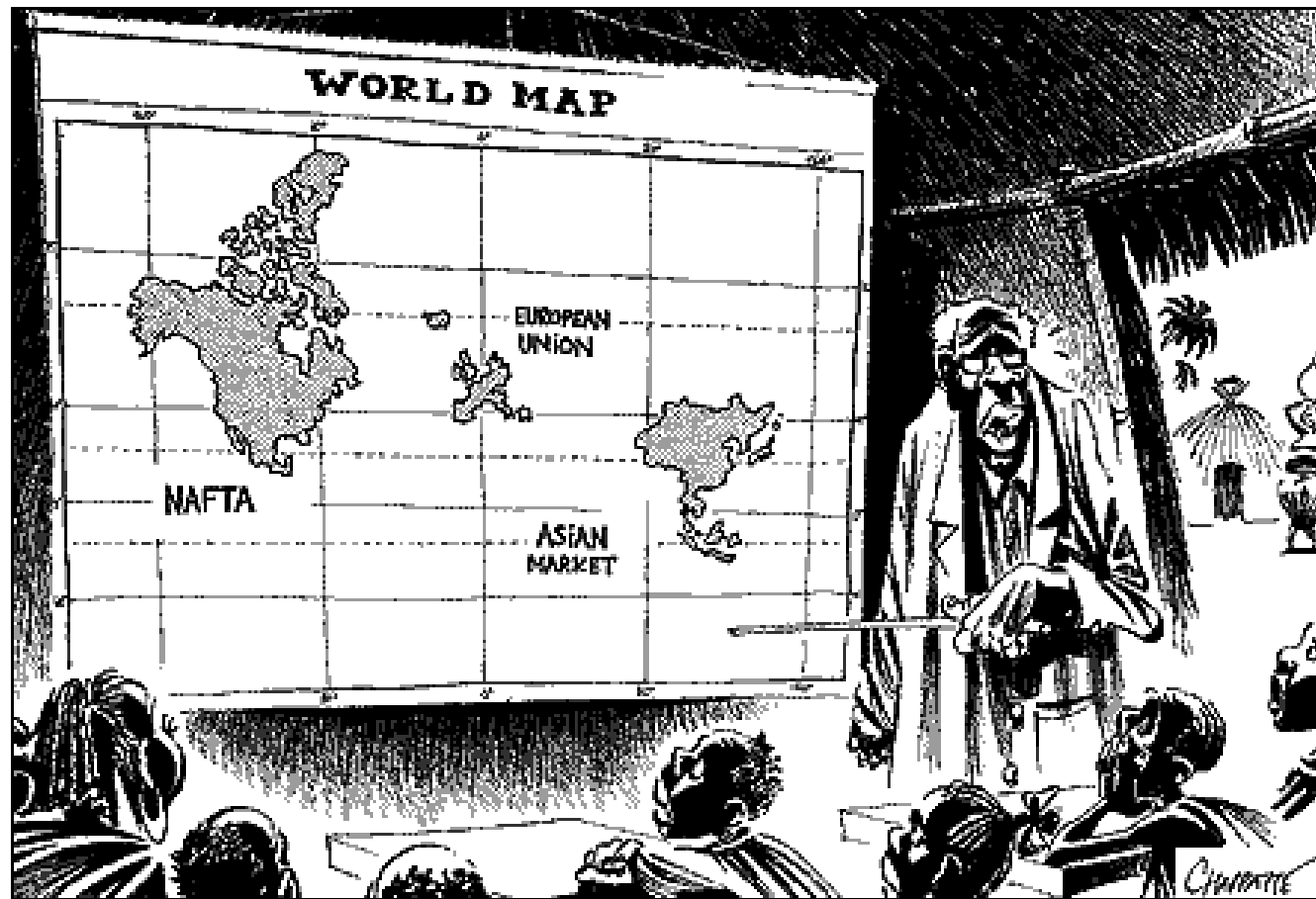

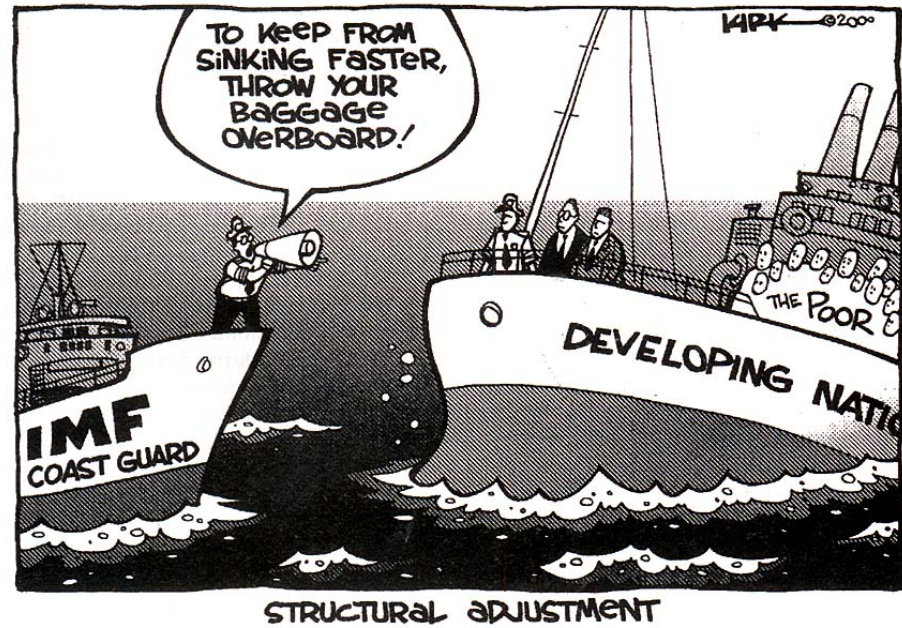
# Business
